NUTRITION BREAKS

Please ensure that students bring their lunch and snacks in the morning. On the odd occasion that it must delivered to school, please make sure your child is aware that it's coming, and that your child knows to pick it up at the office. Print your child's name clearly on the lunch bag.



CLEAN YOUR HANDS

Cleaning your hands is the most effective way to prevent the spread of germs. Regular hand cleaning with soap and water, or an alcohol based hand sanitizer will reduce the risk of getting sick.

Cleaning your hands should occur:

Before preparing meals Before eating After using the washroom After coughing or sneezing After blowing your nose After playing with pets After playing outdoors



Use warm water and soap and lather and scrub for at least 15 seconds if your hands are visibly dirty.

LOCKDOWN DRILLS

Throughout the year, we participate in a safety drill that is meant to further enhance the protection of our student and staff. This procedure is called a LOCKDOWN. The purpose of the lockdown drill is to practice safely securing students and staff within the school in the event of a potentially dangerous incident surrounding the school or within the school itself. In this drill, classroom doors are locked and students must remain in their classrooms, behind locked doors. Students are not allowed outside the room

for any reason. If you, a parent/guardian, arrives at the school while a lockdown is in effect, you will not be allowed in the school until the activity has ended. While we sincerely wish that no event causes us to enact these precautions, we feel that practicing these procedures, just as we practice fire drills, prepares our students and staff to react appropriately in case of an emergency, making our school safer for students and staff. If you have any questions about this safety drill, please call the school and ask to speak with the principal.
