FLU SEASON IS HERE!!

Washing your hands prevents the spread of germs and reduces your risk of getting sick. Wash your hands after:

coughing or sneezing blowing your nose using the washroom playing with pets playing outdoors and before preparing meals and eating



Use warm water and soap, lather and scrub for at least 15 seconds. Have children sing the ABC song, so they scrub for long enough. Alcohol-based hand sanitizers are safe for children and can be used when you don't see any dirt. For more information, talk to your school nurse.

HEAD LICE

This is the time of year that head lice seem to be most active. Please check your child's scalp regularly and treat immediately if you discover any eggs. Please be sure to notify the school so that other children may be checked as well. Our procedure at the school will be to check any student suspected of head lice and request treatment upon the discovery of head lice. Letters will also be sent home with children in the affected class.

Please use an appropriate shampoo as recommended by a pharmacist. The Niagara Regional Health Unit has informed us that the careful removal of all eggs is important and that shampooing alone will not necessarily kill all eggs. PLEASE REMOVE ALL EGGS! Thank you for your support. It is the best way to keep this nuisance under control.



Crossing Guards are not on duty until 8:10 am and school yard supervision begins at 8:15 am. Please do not send your children prior to these times to ensure their safety.


